District 13 had a very successful District Leadership Conference in Burlington, Ontario on May 2nd and 3rd. The DLC was well attended by leaders from the various other D13 sections, Sarnia, Toronto, Montreal, Que. and Saguenay, Que. The conference was organized by the District 13 Vice president Kalpen Vachharajani of the Sarnia section.

The District Leadership Conference is an opportunity for local section to network and develop their executive skills and personal skills as well as knowledge of the ISA organization.

Twenty-eight representatives from the five sections in the District 13 attended the conference.

The weekend started with a presentation from Terri Knox called "All Stressed up & everywhere to go". Terri went through a workshop with attendees and led them through different techniques on how to deal with internal and external stresses in your home and work life.

The guest speaker was Robert Plashca and his presentation on International Project Work in the Middle
