


## Student Poster Session at the 2013 Expo

# District 13 (Eastern Canada) District Leadership Conference Report

Each year, each of ISA's 14 geographic districts holds a district leadership conference where volunteer leaders from the sections within the district gather to share ideas, conduct society business, get leadership training, and discuss society-level issues.

On the weekend of May 4-5, 2013, ISA members of the Eastern Canadian district, known as district 13, gathered in Chicoutimi, Quebec to participate in their own D13 district leadership conference. Hosting the DLC were the ISA Saguenay/Lac St. Jean Section and D13 District-VP Antonio Alves.

"The Saguenay/Lac St. Jean Section is a unique ISA section as it provides most of its programming entirely in French, in light of the very large community of French speaking automation professionals in this important aluminum mining/smelting area," said Alves, "However, the Saguenay/Lac St. Jean Section makes an active point of responding to the needs of both English and French speakers in the area by providing resources for all of its ISA members, including members in Quebec as well as in Canada's maritime provinces. This openness contributed to what was a very successful DLC for us. For members from our Montreal Section, they enjoyed being able to compare notes with other French-speaking colleagues in the Saguenay region. And for our English-speaking members from Ontario, it was a great opportunity for them to practice their French in a friendly bilingual atmosphere."

The Saguenay/Lac Jean area is located in Northern Quebec and is a considerable distance from most of the other local ISA Sections in District 13. Many of the attendees arrived by plane, and attendees from the ISA Sarnia Section had to take no less than 4 flights to finally arrive at the DLC hotel in Chicoutimi. Total driving time from Toronto, Ontario to Chicoutimi is approximately 10-12 hours. Following a tradition that dates back many years, the District 13 DLC rotates through the various local sections in the district. With this year's DLC being in Chicoutimi, Quebec, attendees welcomed the chance to see another part of their country.

Despite its small size, the town of Chicoutimi boasts a large modern hotel thanks to the healthy mining industry in the area. The DLC kicked off with a fully-catered cocktail party in the



hotel's disco on the Friday night, and featured a formal Saturday night dinner with a French provincial-style fondue. Attendees also enjoyed full hot breakfasts and a wide selection of local Quebec cheeses during coffee breaks.



Due to Chicoutimi's remote location, most attendees from Eastern Canada arrived by plane, flying into the town's military base.

The DLC program followed the ISA's traditional 2-day format. On the Saturday, attendees listened to a wide range of presentations on leadership topics, professional development, and society-issues. This included both in-person talks and several Skype-based presentations from ISA headquarters in Raleigh, North Carolina. On the Sunday, the District leaders held their annual district business meeting, which included annual section reports, electing district officers, and the annual district budget.

In attendance were representatives from the Hamilton, Sarnia, Toronto, Montreal, and Saguenay/Lac St. Jean sections. In all, 12 ISA volunteer leaders participated in the DLC, including 1 new leader who had never attended a DLC before. Also in attendance was Tim Feldman, the ISA's director of global products and services, who flew up from Raleigh, North Carolina to be one of the DLC's guest speakers.

Guy Savard, past-president of the Saguenay/Lac St. Jean section was particularly excited to host this year's DLC. "The District Leadership Conference is a great opportunity for local ISA leaders to come together and share ideas. We were delighted to be this year's hosts, and to be able to give something back to the ISA, "says Savard.

At the DLC, Saturday consisted of a busy program that began with a 7:30am breakfast. District 13 DVP Antonio Alves called the meeting to order, and opening remarks were made by Savard. ISA President-elect Peggie Koon also welcomed attendees to the DLC via a Skype-based live video feed direct from her home in Augusta, Georgia.

The first speaker of the day was ISA staff member Tim Feldman, who gave a presentation as to how the society was doing from a business perspective and various new developments in terms of member services. An update was given on how the new society-level website development project was progressing, and how the society was working hard to provide member services and training opportunities for the growing international market. Tim closed his presentation with a motivational address about how, as a member-driven non-profit organization, the ISA is working hard to respond to the growing needs of its members around the world.

# Standards Update: ISA96.06 - Partial Stroke Testing for Valve Actuators

The ISA96.05 subcommittee, Partial Stroke Testing for Valve Actuators, will hold a subcommittee meeting at the SIS-Tech offices in Houston, Texas, on Wednesday, June 26th to coincide with the Valve World Americas Expo and Conference 2013, June 25-26 at the George R. Brown Convention Center.

At a recent ISA96.05 meeting, there was discussion of the related International Instrument Users' Association WIB draft guidelines and their relation to the ISA technical report.

Input has been gathered from partial stroke testing manufacturers and users, and ISA96.05 is ready to begin work on the revision of ANSI/ISA-TR96.05.01, *Partial Stroke Testing of Automated Block Valves*.
